



7.0 Príomhshuimh na Gníomhaíochta

7.2 Ard-Oifig an Phoist

Ba í Ard-Oifig an Phoist ar Shráid Sackville (Sráid Uí Chonaill) an príomhshuimh a bhí le gabháil, áit a ainmníodh mar cheanncheathrú an Rialtais Shealadaigh. Bhí cúigear ball den Rialtas Sealadach lonnaithe ansin: An Piarsach, Ó Conghaile, Ó Cléirigh, Mac Diarmada agus Ó Pluингcéad. Bhí thart ar 350 fear agus bean sa gharastún—Óglaigh na hÉireann, Cumann na mBan, Arm Cathartha na hÉireann agus na Raidhfilí Ibeirneacha ina measc. Ina measc siúd a bhí in Ard-Oifig an Phoist ag tráth éigin le linn na seachtaine bhí Harry Boland, Winifred Carney, Michael Collins, Rory Connolly (mac le Séamas a bhí cúig bliana déag d'aois), Éamonn Duggan, Desmond FitzGerald, Louise Gavan Duffy, Julia Grenan, Seán Lemass, Diarmuid Lynch, Finian Lynch, Seán McGrath, an tAlra Elizabeth O'Farrell, Seán T. Ó Ceallaigh, Liam Mac Piarais, James Ryan, Arthur Shields, Michael Staines, Oscar Traynor, Domhnall Ua Buachalla.

Ba í an tuiscint a bhí ann nuair a bheadh an Forógra léite amach agus Poblacht na hÉireann bunaithe, go gcuirfí Óglaigh na hÉireann agus Arm Cathartha na hÉireann le chéile mar arm Phoblacht na hÉireann. Mar ard-cheannfort ar Bhriogáid Bhaile Átha Cliath d'arm úr Phoblacht na hÉireann, bhí Séamas Ó Conghaile i gceannas ar choisint Ard-Oifig an Phoist agus stiúir sé oibríochtaí chomh maith ar fud na cathrach go dtí gur gearradh an chumarsáid níos déanaí sa tseachtain.

Chuir garastún Ard-Oifig an Phoist baracáid ar chuid de na sráideanna máguaird agus ghabháil sé seilbh ar roinnt foirgneamh taobh leis chomh maith, lena n-áirítear roinnt foirgneamh trasna na sráide. Tráthnóna Dé Luain chuir an garastún ruaig ar ionsáí marcra ó ghrúpa Lannairí a thug faoi ruathar meargánta síos Sráid Sackville Uachtarach thar Ghallán Nelson faoi lámhach ceannairceach ó na foirgnimh ar an dá thaobh den tsráid. Thit ríail agus reacht as a chéile agus rinneadh creachadh ar a lán siopaí agus stóir i Sráid Sackville agus sna sráideanna máguaird ón Mháirt ar aghaidh.


Ón gCéadaoin ar aghaidh, bhí Halla na Saoirse, Ard-Oifig an Phoist agus foirgnimh eile i Sráid Sackville faoi lámhach gunnaí móra agus loiscneach, ón mbád gunna Helga a bhí ar ancaire sa Life go príomha. Bhí an tÓstán Imperial a bhí os cionn siopa ilrannach Clery's, trasna na sráide ó Ard-Oifig an Phoist, ar cheann de na chéad fhoirgneamh a cuireadh trí thine; ní raibh sé i bhfad ansin go raibh formhór na bhfoirgneamh idir é sin agus an Life faoi bharr lasrach. Chreid Ó Conghaile go soineanta nach n-úsáideadh arm na Breataine gunnaí móra i gceantair na cathrach toisc go mbeadh drogall orthu maoin ar bith a scrios de bharr gur chaipitlithe a bhí iontu.

Ar an Déardaoin, sheol Ó Conghaile an Leifteanant Seán McLoughlin le páirtí 30 fear chun urphost a bhunú in áitreabh an Irish Independent agus an Nation ar Shráid na Mainistreach Láir. Ba bhall é McLoughlin, a bhí bliain is fiche d'aois, de chuid chomplacht Seán Heuston, a ghlac páirt sa ghleo san Institiúid Déircíochta, agus bhí an Piarsach agus Ó Conghaile tógtha leis cheana. Ina dhiaidh sin, gortaíodh rúitín Shéamais Uí Chonghaile go holc taobh amuigh d'Ard-Oifig an Phoist; cé go raibh sé sáinnithe ar shínteán, lean sé air i mbun oibríochtaí a stiúradh.

Faoi thráthnóna Dé hAoine bhí Ard-Oifig an Phoist ar thine, agus ag an bpóinte sin cinneadh an garastún a aslonnú agus bogadh ó thuaidh trí Shráid an Mhúraigh, a raibh criathar á dhéanamh di le rois piléar ó raidhfilí agus meaisíng hunnaí, go dtí monarcha Williams & Woods i Sráid na Breataine Móire (Sráid Parnell). Stiúir Ó Rathghaille ruathar ina raibh 30 Óglach páirteach ann chun an bealach a réiteach. Rinneadh lot marfach air agus ar roinnt dá fhear.

Toisc go raibh Ó Conghaile ar éagumas, fágadh stiúradh an aslonnaithe faoi McLoughlin. Dearbhaíodh an fhreagracht sin lena ardú céime go ceannfort ní ba dhéanaí an tráthnóna sin. D'aslonnaigh an garastún ansin agus ghlac siad suímh úra, i dtithe feadh Shráid an Mhúraighe go príomha. Maidin Dé Sathairn, mhol McLoughlin go dtroidfeadh an garastún a bhealachadh trí Shráid Anraí agus trí Shráid an tSéipéil chun nascadh le 1ú Cathlán an Cheannfort Daly i gceantar na gCeithre Chúirteanna. Ó ba rud é go gcuirfí a lán sibhialtach i mbaol dá ndéanfaí amhlaidh, cinneadh ag cruinniú chúigear ball an Rialtais Shealadaigh a bhí i láthair go ndéanfaidís géilleadh a idirbheartú chun tuilleadh básanna a sheachaint.


The General Post Office area as shown on a map issued by the Hibernian Fire and General Insurance Company shortly after the Rising. (O'Mahony Collection).

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


The GPO and Nelson's Pillar as they appeared about a decade before the Rising.

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


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
Pages from Joseph Plunkett's field notebook for the week of the Rising. (Ms. 4,700).

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

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

7.2 Ard-Oifig an Phoist



Michael Collins (1890-1922) was born at Woodfield, Clonakilty, Co. Cork. He went to London at the age of sixteen as a clerk in the Post Office. In the Rising he was aide-de-camp to Joseph Plunkett. His experience of the Rising taught him that it was unwise to take on the British army from static positions: he later planned and directed the guerilla warfare that was to prove so successful in the War of Independence (1918-21). 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
Order by Connolly to destroy the railway line, probably to the north of Amiens Street station, Tuesday 25 April 1916. (Ms. 15,002 (2), de Courcy-Wheeler Papers).

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Winifred Carney; a member of Cumann na mBan and the ICA, she was James Connolly's secretary.

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A commemorative postcard for Capt. Thomas J. Weaver, from Enniscorthy, Co. Wexford who commanded the Hibernian Bank outpost diagonally across the street from the GPO at the corner of Lower Abbey Street. He controlled the approach from Amiens Street station. Aged twenty-six, he was shot dead on Wednesday 26 April. (Album 113).

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
Commandant Seán McLoughlin (1895-1916) was a son of Patrick McLoughlin, an ITGWU activist. Socialist and radical in outlook, he was a member of the Gaelic League, Fianna Éireann, the IRB and the Irish Volunteers. As a commandant, his life was at risk following the surrender, but the authorities overlooked his rank probably because a British captain had removed his tabs. (Camillian Post, Spring 1948).

A commemorative postcard for O'Rahilly who was shot leading a charge in Moore Street. Born in Ballylongford, Co. Kerry, Michael Joseph O'Rahilly (1875-1916) was prominent in Sinn Féin and was treasurer of the Irish Volunteers. He supported MacNeill's countermand, but joined the garrison in the GPO, supposedly saying 'I helped to wind up the clock, so I might as well hear it strike'. (O'Mahony Album).
