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INTRODUCTION

Biography

John (Edward) Jordan (8 April 1930-6 June 1988), poet, short story writer, lecturer in English, reviewer and social commentator, was born in Dublin. He was educated at Synge Street Christian Brothers' School, University College Dublin (UCD), and Pembroke College, Oxford. He lectured in English at UCD, Princeton University and Memorial University of Newfoundland. In 1969 he resigned from his post as college lecturer in UCD. He edited the second series of the journal *Poetry Ireland* 1963-1968 and the first eight issues of *Poetry Ireland Review* 1981-1983. He frequently contributed to the radio magazine programme *Sunday Miscellany* broadcast by Radio Telefís Éireann. As literary and theatre critic he reviewed for *Hibernia* and other national newspapers. His interest in acting continued from his period as a student to a spell with the Dublin Gate Theatre. He died while attending the Merriman School in Cardiff and is buried at Mount Jerome Cemetery, Dublin.

His published works include: *Patrician Stations*, Dublin: New Writers' Press, 1971; *A Raft from Flotsam*, Dublin: Gallery Press, 1975; *Blood and Stations*, Dublin: Gallery Press, 1976 and *With Whom Did I Share the Crystal*, Dublin: John F. Deane, 1977. A collection of short stories *Yarns* was published by Poolbeg Press of Dublin in 1977. His *Collected Poems*, edited by Hugh McFadden were published in Dublin by Dedalus Press in 1991. In the same year the *Collected Short Stories* were published by Poolbeg Press.

Tributes to Jordan were published after his death in *Irish University Review*, vol. 18, no. 2 (Autumn 1988) pp. 263-275.
